- Please strictly refrain from welcome parties for new students, club members, etc., as these are especially dangerous.

Additional measures such as changes to how classes are conducted may be requested based on the future COVID-19 situation, so please stay alert to the latest information.

Appropriate actions based on individual awareness are necessary in order to bring an end to the spread of infections as soon as possible. I ask for your understanding and cooperation so that you can once again fully enjoy normal university life and, most importantly of all, to protect your lives and those of the people around you.
