Announcement Regarding Administration of Classes Accompanying Issuance of State of Emergency Declaration (April 23, 2021), etc.

This academic year, as a general rule, classes are being conducted face-to-face while implementing adequate measures against infection. Classes are also being conducted remotely for subjects where remote teaching is expected to provide sufficient educational effectiveness, etc. from the perspective of further prevention of the spread of infections.

Nevertheless, as I am sure you are already aware, on this day, April 23, the government issued a state of emergency declaration for the Tokyo metropolis. In light of this situation, the university has decided to conduct classes remotely during this period as a general rule in order to ensure the safety of students and their families as well as faculty and staff members.

However, please note that classes that cannot be conducted remotely or are necessary in order to acquire qualifications, etc. and must be conducted during this period will still be conducted face-to-face.

Also, please pay special attention to messages to your email address registered in the academic affairs system (LiveCampus), etc., as students will be notified by the faculty member in charge regarding changes to how classes are conducted, etc.

Furthermore, restrictions on entry to university campuses are expected to be implemented, with exceptions made for graduate students scheduled to complete their studies in September, etc. or those entering for a truly pressing reason such as looking after living creatures. Details will be provided separately. The entrance checks at the Main Gates of the university may become crowded, so please line up leaving space between yourself and others and try to arrive early with plenty of time.

Additional measures may also be implemented based on the future conditions of the spread of COVID-19 infections, etc.

I humbly ask for your understanding and cooperation with these measures in order to ensure both your safety and opportunities for learning as well as to restore a desirable university life by bringing an end to the COVID-19 pandemic as soon as possible.
